### Introduction

This meeting provides a platform for experts to critically evaluate the evolving role of pelvic exenteration (PE) in modern gynecologic oncology. Historically, PE has been a last-resort curative surgery for advanced gynecologic cancers. However, its relevance is now being reconsidered in light of advances in imaging, chemotherapy, radiotherapy, and new diagnostic tools. As the incidence of such advanced cancers declines due to improved screening and vaccination strategies, the need for aggressive surgical interventions like PE is being re-evaluated. In this context, we will explore how PE is being integrated with contemporary treatment strategies aimed not only at achieving cures but also at preserving patients' quality of life. Discussions will focus on balancing the oncological benefits of PE with its potentially debilitating effects on functional outcomes, emphasizing personalized care approaches. Additionally, we will examine the role of emerging therapies that may reduce the need for such extensive surgery. The program will highlight how surgical expertise is adapting to this new landscape, where the number of cases is decreasing, and centralization of care has become increasingly important.
